#### IAG STUDENT SECTION DEVELOPMENT GRANTS

### **Application Procedure**

## **Amount and Purpose of Awards**:

One-time grants of up to \$800US are available to IAG member societies for the purpose of fostering development of Student Sections within their societies.

## What information does the application need to include?

The application needs to describe in detail the purposes for which the funds will be used and how the national organization will follow up the funded activity. For example, following a student event at an annual meeting the society would contact students and invite them to join at a reduced cost.

#### What is a "Student Section"?
